Spelling Words	<i>See your list in your folder.</i>
Reading/LA	Be able to explain that the main idea tells the most important idea or theme of a story. The details explain more about the main idea. Know that an opinion tells how someone feels about something. Know that to combine a sentence you must use and, or – but.
Science	Be able to explain how heat is measured. Know the tools used to measure heat.
Social Studies	Be able to explain what it means to live in a democracy. Know that living in a democracy gives your rights and freedoms.
Math	Know that multiplication is the same as repeated addition. Be able to compare equations using multiplication factors. Know your six, seven, eight and nine multiplication tables.
