Beecher 5th Grade Girls Participate in "Rites of Passage" Program

On October 25, 2007 the first session of the newly created "Rites of Passage Program" for Fifth Grade Girls at Beecher Hills Elementary was held. The program was developed by Dr. Angela Bolin, Beecher Hills School Counselor, and Mrs. Yvonnia Henderson, Community Volunteer.

"A rite is a ceremony or celebration. Passage refers to the movement from one stage to another. Thus, the adolescent rite of passage is a supervised developmental and educational process whose goal is to assist young people in attaining the knowledge and accepting responsibilities, privileges, and duties of an adult member of a society." (Warfield-Coppock, 1992)

"Rites of Passage Program" will be geared toward promoting solidarity, self-discipline, cultural pride, learning about focusing/meditation, Ecopsychology, effective communication skills, career path exploration, men-

toring, leadership development and a sense of community. Participants will experience a tour of the community, interview elders in the community, and explore the changing roles of adulthood. The activities will celebrate African culture and art, promote community involvement and prepare participants for the coming-of-age celebration through African dance, song, art and crafts.

Will HR 900 "GREAT Plan" Really Benefit Beecher Hills??

If someone walked up to you on the street and said "Would you like to never have to pay ad valorem (property) taxes again?", initially, you would probably say yes. Is there anyone who *likes* to pay taxes? But, if you thought for a second you'd realize what those taxes pay for and would wonder how those essential services would be provided in the future. Public safety (police, fire, jails, etc), **schools**, and county services (parks, road work, etc) need funding.

Speaker Richardson is proposing that all ad valorem taxes are repealed and that sales tax would make up the difference. The proposal, called the **GREAT** (**G**eorgia's **R**epeal of **E**very **A**d Valorem **T**ax) **Plan**, is somewhat silent on those details except to say that sales and income tax would take care of funding everything and he promises that counties and school districts would receive funding equal to the revenues earned in 2006 (not 2007 or 2008).

His plan would be to repeal many of the current sales tax exemptions. You would now pay taxes on food, medical services and prescriptions, insurance, hair cuts, tax and legal services, lawn maintenance, memberships, tuition to colleges and private schools, doctor visits, maid services, babysitters/nannies, etc.

There is a worksheet on the Georgia PTA website (www.georgiapta.org), under Capitol Watch, that you can use to see if you would pay more or less in taxes. You can also find the most current version of the "GREAT" Plan at www.thegreatplanforgeorgia.com.

Approximately half of the funding for County Schools is generated by property tax revenues. This proposed Georgia Constitutional amendment to abolish property taxes, HR 900, also eliminates local school boards' abilities to raise their own revenue to fund their schools. PTA opposes this proposed amendment because PTA supports the rights of local school boards (and municipalities) to raise their own revenue and administer that revenue. Those sources of revenue allow the local school boards to provide the services and programs that their constituents want. Isn't that why we elect local school boards and commissioners?

Let your legislator know that your school board needs to keep control of its local source of funding. Call your legislator now. Make a difference for your child, your school, your community. It's not hard and it is important.

Keeping Children Safe During the Holidays

The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) urges parents not to let their guard down during the holidays. Shopping and traveling require extra attention and forethought to ensure children's safety.

NCMEC suggests talking to children about safety issues before heading to a crowded shopping mall or airport. Parents and their kids need a plan in case they become separated, which can happen more easily as crowds build through the holiday season. Some tips from NCMEC:

• Designate a spot to meet in case you become separated.



- Teach children to look for people who can help such as uniformed security officers or another parent with children.
- Never drop off older children at a mall or public place without a clear plan for picking them up—where, what time, what to do in case of a change in plans. Remind children to remain in the area where they become separated.

- Never dress children in clothing that displays their first or last names, which might prompt unwelcome attention from people looking to start a conversation with your child.
- If your child is traveling alone this holiday season, specify that the child will be alone when you make the reservation. Visit the airport or bus/train terminal prior to departure so your child knows what to expect.
- Encourage children, especially those traveling alone, not to become too friendly with other passengers or reveal any personal information.
