

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Beecher Prepares Students for Testing

Teachers and students at Beecher Hills are preparing for the Criterion References Competency Tests, or CRCT which will be administered April 21—25. The CRCT is a state mandated achievement test for students in grades 1 through 8. The CRCT covers Reading, Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies; however, students in 1st & 2nd grades do not take the Science and Social Studies portions.

3rd grade students are required to meet expectations on the **reading** portion of the CRCT in order to be considered for promotion to the next grade level. **5th and**

8th grade students are required to meet expectations on the reading & math portions of the test to be promoted to the next grade level.

How to Help Your Child:

- Reassure your child that there will be ample time to take the tests.
- Be sure your child gets plenty of sleep, has a nourishing breakfast and is at school on time.
- Encourage good test taking skills: Follow directions carefully, avoid careless errors and review your work.
- Explain the purpose of the test, let your child know that you consider the test to be important, and that they should try their best.





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Kohl's Kids Who Care Scholarship Program Stand-up kids deserve to stand out.

Kohl's plans to award over \$300,000 in scholarships and

prizes to more than 1,900 kids whose volunteer efforts have made a positive impact on their communities. Nominees must be between the ages of 6 and 18 and not yet a high school graduate as of March 15, 2008. Each nominee must be nominated by parents, educators or community members age 21 years or older. Nomination forms may only be completed and submitted at www.kohlskidswhocare.com. No paper nomination forms will be accepted. Forms must be submitted no

later than midnight CST March 15,

Nominations should describe how the nominee has contributed to the community in a meaningful way by performing volunteer services that helped non-family members. The young person's actions must be described in detail and should document efforts that are above and beyond what is normally expected of a child his or her age. The volunteer activity must have occurred within the last 12 months. Nomination forms will be separated into two age groups: ages 6-12 and ages 13-18. Kohl's will recognize young volunteers at three levels:

♦ 1900+ Store level winners (earn \$50 gift card, certificate and entry into the regional competition)

- 190 Regional winners (earn \$1,000 scholarship for post secondary education and entry into the national competition)
- \$ 10 National winners (receive \$5,000 scholarship and a \$1,000 grant to the charity of their choice)

Winners will be notified in June 2008. Financial need or academic performance will not be considered in the review and selection of winners. As a supporter of equal opportunity, Kohl's will work with Scholarship America to distribute awards to minority students on a basis at least proportionate to the number of known minority nominees.

Principal's Corner: Testing Tips from Dr. Hall

Greetings!

As you know, we are now into our testing season. The third and fifth grade writing tests and the Iowa Test of Basic Skills (ITBS) at grades three and five have been administered to date. To this end, we are anticipating stellar results as we continue to elevate in 2008!

Additionally, the Georgia Criterion Competency Test (CRCT) will be administered from April 21, 2008 until April 30, 2008. We are continuing to work hard with our students in insuring that the students at Beecher Hills not only achieve, but exceed grade level content standards. You can as-

sist us in reaching this goal by making sure that:

- Students come to school daily and on time.
- Students attend assigned tutorials.
- ♦ Students complete their homework and projects.
- Students take advantage of the web-based programs that are available for CRCT Practice (CRCT Study Island and GOAS). Students should have their passwords.
- You attend all upcoming grade level parent meetings.

- ♦ You assist students with their CRCT Study Packets.
- You confer with your child's teacher about specific ways you can help your child perform at his/her optimal level.

Again, we are expecting greater accomplishments and achievement this school year. We will continue to be a Title I Distinguished School by meeting Adequate Yearly Progress for eight consecutive years. Beecher Hills will also meet or exceed 70% or more of our APS targets while closing the achievement gap.
