Beecher Students Master Math

During the first four weeks of the school year, Beecher Hills 3rd, 4th & 5th grade students have received valuable math tutorial from Mr. Alphonso Carey, founder of the non-profit, Mathematics & Technology Help, Inc.

Mr. Carey's goal is to help students score higher on the math portion of the CRCT. As an added incentive, Mr. Carey has donated four 5foot tall trophies to Beecher Hills to be awarded as follows: 1 per grade (3rd, 4th & 5th) to the student who achieves the highest math CRCT score, and one for the overall class with the highest math CRCT scoring average.

Mr. Carey utilizes a special method called the Carey Method to



Beecher Students Attend Academic Challenge Cluster

"Minds Wide Open - Ready to Learn"! That is this year's theme for the Atlanta Public School (APS) Program for the Gifted and Talented Elementary Academic Challenge Cluster at Campbell Academy. The Challenge Cluster helps to develop the talents and abilities of gifted students. The Georgia State Board of Education defines a gifted student as a person who demonstrates high levels of intellectual and/or creative ability, as well as an exceptionally high degree of motivation.

Twenty-six (26) Beecher students attend the Elementary Academic Challenge Cluster each Tuesday. The Cluster is located at the Lena Jean Campbell Academy. Dr. Sharon Jones is the Gifted Program Coordinator. Ms. Dot Blue is the Beecher Hills Cluster Staff contact, and Ms. Sheri Rennie is the Beecher Hills Challenge Eligibility Committee Chairperson.

Students from 35 APS elementary schools attend the Campbell Cluster weekly. 26 Beecher Hills students travel by school bus from Beecher to the Elementary Academic Cluster on Tuesday

mornings to receive a full day of Gifted Program instruction.

The Challenge Program serves gifted and talented students with a variety of programs to meet individual needs. Course material is divided into "study modules". Cluster study modules are led by Cluster Staff and include: Global Thinking, Ms. Dot Blue; Analytical Thinking, Mr. Richard Hatcher; Creative Thinking, Ms. LaToya Jenkins; Research Skills, Ms. Lesli Burton; Problem Solving, Ms.

Markii Jacobs; and Communications, Ms. Adele Pollard.

Academic Challenge Cluster classes began the week of August 28. Challenge Cluster qualification is achieved when students meet 3 out of 4 criteria for placement. The four criteria are as follows: (1) Intellectual Ability—above 96% of others tested (2) Achievement—90% & above (3) Creativity—90% & above (4) Motivation – GPA: A's and B's (primarily As).

The deadline for student referrals in Grades K – 3 is December 4, 2007. The 4th and 5th grade students have already been referred and will be testing this month (October).

Challenge Cluster Program expectations are high and require the joint efforts of students, parents and teachers. Proposed educational field experiences for the 2007-2008 Campbell Challenge Cluster include: Jekyll Island 4-H Center, U.S. Space & Rocket Center in Huntsville, AL, Washington, D.C. and during summer 2008—China!

Prepare for Emergencies: Pack An Emergency Preparedness Kit

National Preparedness Month is a nationwide effort held each September to encourage Americans to take simple steps to prepare for emergencies in their homes, businesses and schools. National Preparedness Month 2007 is sponsored by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

Emergency Preparedness Kit Items:

You should keep enough supplies in your home to meet the needs of you and your family for at least three days. Build an emergency supply kit to take with you in an evacuation. The basics to stock in your portable kit include: water; non-perishable food; batterypowered or hand crank radio and/or an NOAA Weather Radio; flashlight; extra batteries; first aid kit; whistle to signal for help; dusk mask, plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place; moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation; wrench or pliers to turn off utilities; can opener for canned food; and local maps. Keep these items in an easy to carry container such as a covered trash container, a large backpack or duffle bag.
